What is Speech Bubbles?

Speech Bubbles is a creative intervention using drama to support 5-7 year olds with Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN) to develop their communication skills, confidence and wellbeing.

Weekly drama sessions are led in school by a Speech Bubbles trained artist working with a member of school staff, usually a teaching assistant. The content of each session is built around stories told to by children in the group. Children are at various times authors, actors and audience. As well as promoting creativity, Speech Bubbles creates a safe and fun environment to practise receptive, attentive and expressive skills which form the basis of communication and help children to socialise and learn.

What is SLCN?

A child with speech, language and communication needs (SLCN):

- Might struggle to say words or sentences.
- May not understand words that are being used, or the instructions they hear.
- May have difficulties knowing how to talk and listen to others in a conversation.
- May present as withdrawn or isolated.
- May express their communication need as 'poor behaviour'.

Why Does SLCN Matter?

SLCN is a growing problem for children, schools and society as a whole. The Communication Trust reports that in some areas of social disadvantage as many as 50% of children are starting school without the communication skills they need to succeed.

Language is a major vehicle for learning and critical to children's mental, social and intellectual development. If SLCNs are not supported in the early years they may become increasingly difficult to address.

SLCNs are strongly linked in later life with mental illness, unemployment, relationship breakdown, and offending. Between 60-90% of young offenders have speech, language and communication needs.

How Can Theatre Artists Help?

Theatre Artists are uniquely placed to help children with SLCNs because of our whole body approach to communication. We recognise that developing communication includes an awareness of body language, proximity, gesture, facial expression, eye contact, sounds, humour, words and this leads to more complex language.

We use our understanding of performance to help children reduce their anxieties and find positive emotional states. We use our understanding of story and play to make Speech Bubbles sessions fun.

Why Speech Bubbles?

Best Practice

Speech Bubbles has been developed in collaboration with schools, theatre makers and speech and language therapists. The programme has been carefully designed, refined, and thoroughly researched by experts. We know what works, we understand why, and we have evidence to support those claims.

Artists in Schools

The relationships schools have with visiting artists is changing. Though many teachers appreciate the benefits of creative learning, they are increasingly being asked to justify its use in a concrete way. Speech Bubbles solves a pressing problem for schools and embeds creative learning in their improvement plans. The project is evidenced by several independent research institutions and each year our online assessment system produces an impact report for each participating school.

Developing Artists, Developing School Staff

Artists report that Speech Bubbles training feeds in to all their other arts facilitation work. Specialist input develops artists' confidence in facilitating difficult groups and helps theatre companies build a professional participatory arts workforce. An independent research study showed that Teaching Assistants working on Speech Bubbles reported enhanced job satisfaction, new roles in the school, increased personal confidence and capacity. Speech Bubbles training is CPD certified which means that schools can use their training budgets to fund it.

Sharing Costs

Arts and education funding are under increasing pressure so organisations need to adapt and collaborate. Speech Bubbles operates as a Partner Network which means we share many organisational costs. There are not multiple arts organisations having to reinvent the wheel and fundraise for set-up costs, research, accreditation, publicity design, national PR or resources. Speech Bubbles CIO searches for funding that benefits the overall project while theatre partners access pots of local funding so we can all charge less to schools and keep the project sustainable.

Speech Bubbles children really shone, outstripping the 'control' children even though they started each time from a lower baseline. Their lively approach to these questions, as much as the scores they obtained, was suggestive of a change in the way they viewed themselves. They appeared as more competent, storytelling subjects with a perspective on their personal worlds.

Dr Heather Price, University of East London Randomised Control Trial on Speech Bubble: Giving children's stories time, respect and an audience bestows a sense of environmental and self-control. Imaginative play structured and supported by artists can simultaneously generate self-confidence, self-expression and positive relationships. Genuine adult participation in play motivates and scaffolds children's personal and moral growth.

Who Makes a Good Speech Bubbles Partner?
